When this scribe said, “There is one God; and there is none other but he,” Jesus knew that he was talking about His Father.

In Mark 12:29 we read, “Hear, O Israel; the Lord our God is one Lord.” The word, “Lord,” here is directly referring to God, the Father, as we have seen. This verse is a quotation of Deuteronomy 6:4 where the Hebrew word translated, “LORD” is Yahweh, the personal name of God, the Father. The title, “Lord,” in the New Testament is a translation of the Greek word, κυριος, which means, “Master.” This term

often refers to Jesus Christ, as we have seen in 1 Corinthians 8:6. He is our Lord and Saviour. Both the Father and the Son are called, “Lord,” a title that applies perfectly well to either of them, for they both have dominion over us. “But I would have you know, that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and the head of Christ is God” (1 Corinthians 11:3).

Both Paul and Jesus agreed that there is one God, and none other but He, and that this one God is God, the Father, and nobody else.
