often refers to Jesus Christ, as we have seen in 1 Corinthians 8:6. He is our Lord and Saviour. Both the Father and the Son are called, "Lord," a title that applies perfectly well to either of them, for they both have dominion over us. "But I would have you know, that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and the head of Christ is God" (1 Corinthians 11:3).

Both Paul and Jesus agreed that there is one God, and none other but He, and that this one God is God, the Father, and nobody else.
